Report on the Concord Market

US CONCORDS

Publication of our Newsletter was delayed this year to give you some factual ideas on the extent of the huge crop losses to the Concord industry in New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Michigan. A very unusual weather pattern saw us with temperatures in the 80's during late March which forced the Concord vineyards out of dormancy 36 days earlier than average exposing the new growing fruiting shoots to the atmosphere making them vulnerable to damage from freezing temperatures.

DID YOU KNOW?

Concord vineyards are famous for being so winter hardy vs. other fruits, surviving temperatures well below zero but once the new crop fruiting shoots are exposed they are susceptible like any other crop. Several freezes occurred causing widespread crop losses in the states of NY / PA / OH and MI. Concord vineyards are now displaying early crop estimated phases, including average number of clusters per vine and berries per cluster. Total crop loss to the 2012 Concord crop is estimated to be approximately 150-200,000 tons.

The **2011** Concord crop harvested in the US totaled 418,800 tons, 12.2% more than was produced in 2010 and slightly higher than the 10 year average which was 416,400 tons. See Chart 1.

NY / PA / OH

2011: The 3 state area produced 202,210 tons, 6% more than was produced in 2010. The season was accompanied by excellent weather and early harvest. Vineyards went into dormancy in top shape, headed for a big crop in 2012. 2012 losses vs. 2011 are estimated to be approximately 60 percent. Damage is spotty between locations up to 90% loss.

<u>Michigan</u>

The **2011** crop produced 55,100 tons, one of the biggest on record and nearly 3 times more tons than in 2010. The growing season was uneventful and the vines entered winter in great condition following an early harvest season.

2012: Spring frost damage is widespread throughout the state. Many vineyards will not be harvested. Some estimate an 80% reduction from **2011**.

Washington

In **2011** they produced 156,000 tons of Concords, 4% less than in 2010. A fairly poor growing season followed by a late harvest sent the vineyards into winter in reasonable shape with no fall freezes. **2012** WA is the only Concord production area that had no serious spring frost damage and the new crop is estimated to be 10-15% higher than **2011**.

International Concords

Brazil has become a big factor in the N. American Concord market. See our offering on page 1. Large volume of 68 brix is now available for prompt shipment.

Grape Prices

Growers selling their **2011** crops to cash processors received an average of \$251/ton at 16 brix, up 2% from a year ago. Growers delivering to Washington processors averaged \$250 for 16 brix, up \$42/ton or 20.2% from the previous year. See Chart 2.

Concentrate Prices & Market


See Chart 3 - low carryover inventory continued to cause 68 brix prices to increase to approximately \$21.00/gallon in the East and \$20.00 in Washington. Those numbers have bounced around. At the moment only LTL quantities can be found in the US.




The following charts highlight the 'II Concord crop and history of the industrial market.
