A brief report on the Concord grape crop and market appears on pages I and 2. If you have no interest in Concord, please check pages 3 and 4 which describe the industrial ingredients we handle.

US CONCORDS

The 2007 Concord crop harvested in the US totaled 518,470 tons, the second largest crop in history, up 39% from last year and 28% larger than the previous 10 year average.

All 3 growing areas NY-PA-OH, MI and WA had above average crops indicating the growing season in all areas was good to ideal. No serious winter injury, spring frost, poor pollination or fall frost had occurred last year which allowed the grapes to set heavy crops and ripen well. See chart 1.

Grape Prices

Carryover inventory of cash market processors was low going into the 07 harvest and they raised their prices slightly from last year, trying to keep their growers financially healthy and get their share of available grapes. See chart 2.

 $\underline{\text{NY}}$ / $\underline{\text{PA}}$ / $\underline{\text{OH}}$ - The 07 crop was 15 % larger than 06 resulting in a long harvest but good quality. A dry summer & large yields per acre have reduced the quantity of

fruiting wood available for the 08 crop but the fruiting buds should be extra fruitful.

MI - The 07 tonnage was 400% higher than their very short crop in 06. Good weather prevailed throughout the harvest & the vines are in good shape to produce an average crop in 08.

<u>WA</u> - The crop was 42% larger than in 06 but produced above average quality. Prospects for 08 are average for the remaining acreage. It is significant that it is estimated about 10% of the Concord acreage is being removed and the land planted to Hops. WA produced 249,000 tons of Concords in 07 & averaged 210,000 during 03-07.

Concentrate Prices

The opening per gallon prices of 68 brix Concord concentrate increased substantially in WA from the previous year but only slightly in the East. Concentrate being offered out of NY State was priced lower than expected as a major bulk concentrate

processor may have misjudged the market. It reversed the trend where traditionally Eastern prices were about a dollar per gallon higher than Western prices reflecting the freight from Washington to Eastern markets. (The freight is now about \$1.50/gallon) See chart 3.

Market Outlook

Of the 6 US processors who sell bulk Concord juice and concentrate at least 3 of them are already sold out of the 07 production and we expect the others will find ready markets as the months go by. It is suggested that end users who have not booked their requirements through November of 08 should consider doing so.

08 Crop Prospects

Vineyards in all production areas entered the dormant season in very good condition with no fall frost or 07-08 winter injury anywhere. As of March 20 prospects for the 08 crop are a little below average. The most recent 10 year average is 405,000 tons.


INTERNATIONAL CONCORDS

Ontario:


This will be our last report on the Concord industry in Ontario because the lone Concord and Niagara grape processor closed its plant and released all of its growers. A small percentage of the growers are contracted to US grape processors and most of the others have accepted a stipend offer from the government compensating them if they remove their vineyards.

Brazil:


The 08 crop was harvested during January and February and was above average in size. Due to the strong economy and accompanying increased domestic demand for Concord products we do not expect Concord or Concord Type concentrates will be imported into the North American market this year.



The '07 crop was the 2nd largest in history, up 39% from last year and 28% larger than the 10 year average.



Prices paid growers advanced in both Eastern & Western growing areas in spite of the large crop estimate.



'07 prices advanced 20% in the West but only slightly in the East. We don't recall that in our 26 years Western prices were higher than Eastern.

DID YOU KNOW?

The term **BRIX**, measured by specific gravity and refractomer, designates the degrees (%) of natural sucrose (sugar solids) in fruit & vegetable juices. It varies between products & is used to determine volumes, formulas & dilution rates. As the water is boiled off during concentration under heat & vacuum, the fruit or vegetable sucrose remains and the brix increases to optimum levels. Excess heating has detrimental effects on color and flavor. The standard commercially offered brix levels are 50° for Cranberry, 50-65° for berries, 68° for grape & 70° for Apple, Pear and vegetable concentrates.

Concord Grape Essence (Aroma) - 150 fold from Washington & Brazil - "Fold" refers to the usage rate. 1 part essence treats 150 parts of reconstituted Concord juice.
